



## MANUFACTURING, REPAIRING & SERVICING TRANSFORMERS

**S**ituated at the Kanengo industrial area in Lilongwe, K2 Transformers is one of the few companies that manufacture, repair and service transformers.

Arthur Chinyamula of National Product of Malawi Magazine (NPMM) visited the company to find out more on what it is offering to Malawians in terms of products and services.

In an interview with the company's Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Kim Suk-Young, he told NPMM that the company started its operations in Malawi in the year 2016, but within those few years the company has already been paid a visit by Bright Msaka, S.C Minister of Education, Science and Technology who was the then Minister of Natural Resources, Energy and Mining. The Minister came with his team to appreciate what the company is doing for the Malawi nation.

When quizzed about the company's motivation to settle in Malawi, Kim said that he chose Malawi because the country is still under developed in the power sector.

"Malawi is still backward in the power sector and with such a gap; we thought it wise to come here to help fill that gap. We manufacture, repair and service transformers for Electricity Supply Corporation of Malawi (ESCOM) and in that way we help the Malawi government to save costs, time and also taxes," Suk-Young said.

Adding: "We are also a source of employment for some Malawians. We have a programme for attachments for students especially those doing electrical installation in various Technical Colleges. The students gain skills and when they get employed, their life changes."

K2 services are open to both the Malawi government and the private sector like Airtel Malawi for instance.

In addition to manufacturing, repairing, installing, assembling and servicing transformers, the company is also involved in selling motors, generators and also repairing and servicing them when need be.

Suk-Young boasts of taking only three (3) days to service when everything needed to do the work is available despite the persistent blackouts which pose as a challenge to the company.





**“We only take 3 days to service the transformers and quality for our products and services is pegged at 100%,” he said.**

Suk-Young therefore urged people to go to K2 Transformers for all their transformer, motor and generator needs because the company has a 100% guarantee on all their products and services and they also service the equipment.
